NOTES FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear All,

I hope that you and all your family are keeping well and safe. We are always hopeful at St. Peter's and the term has started so well with very few covid cases, and a number of fantastic trips and experiences. We are, however, realistic about how quickly Omnicron spreads, so we are remaining very vigilant and we know the path forward will not be easy! Our risk assessment remains similar to before Christmas, we are maintaining a balance between teaching and learning, as well as keeping safety as a top priority. We are working closely with Public Health England, following guidance to provide a proportionate response, tracking cases across the school and then putting in additional safety measures where necessary. Ventilation and wearing face coverings remains key, as well as hand washing and social distancing.

In other news, we are now in full swing with clubs and opportunities for all children. Our school's vision is 'Unlocking the potential in all, empowering a community of hope'. This is really seen in our clubs developing the children's talents and skills. We have seen so many children signing up for clubs this term

and embracing new challenges - our Football Club has so many new girl members, this is really inspiring to see! This term also sees our residential visits to PGL and Rand Farm, a wonderful chance for children to build their independence, to experience something new, develop friendships and have fun. Forest Schools has also been established for our EYFS children, the chance to explore and learn skills through play and exploration. Trips to the Cathedral and workshops in school are really bringing the curriculum to life, Family Learning is up and running, such a joy to see after so many restrictions!



As our value is 'self-belief', lots of the children have been exploring the concept of 'growth mindset', trying something new and believing in themselves. As parents, I would encourage you to make 2022 a great year, try something new and encourage your children to develop their self-belief, achieving in whatever they wish to - from football, dancing and swimming to more unusual hobbies....whatever floats your boat!

PARKING ISSUES ON PENNELL STREET

I am unfortunately having to write to you again about the dangerous and inconsiderate parking around school. I know pick up and drop off times are difficult and very busy due to large amounts of children on our site and the roads around school are very narrow and often packed. However, a small minority of parents are still parking without any thought for our children's safety. Three point turns right outside school are not acceptable and this selfish and inconsiderate driving will not be tolerated.

This week there were a large proportion of parents parked on the double yellow lines, as well as the back of school. This is so dangerous and I was surprised that no-one was hurt with the amount of reversing, 3 point turns and dangerous driving. The Police have been involved and are now regularly attending the school to monitor parking, making sure everyone is safe, with parents parking sensibly and driving with due care and attention.

Unfortunately, there are a small group of parents who repeatedly park on the double yellow lines and on the zigzag lines, not just when it is raining. This is obviously both dangerous and illegal. This parking can pose a safety risk to pupils and parents that do walk and cycle to school, as well as to other road users.

The Highway Code rule 238 states You MUST NOT wait or park on yellow lines during the times of operation shown on nearby time plates (or zone entry signs if in a Controlled Parking Zone) - see 'Traffic signs' and 'Road markings'. Double yellow lines indicate a prohibition of waiting at any time even if there are no upright signs. You MUST NOT wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers, on school entrance markings (see 'Road markings') when upright signs indicate a prohibition of stopping. I do understand that parents/guardians will sometimes need to drive their children to school, however I would urge where possible to park away from the school and then walk in. Pennell Street is too small for parents to park down. Please could you think of the safety of ALL our children and refrain from parking on the zigzag and double yellow lines or across resident's driveways as this is an offence which could also result in a Penalty Charge Notice.

In order to support our families that need to drive, we have set up a new 'Park and Stride' in conjunction with the pub opposite the school - 'The Miller's Arms'. The landlady has kindly given parents permission to use her car park at the times of picking up and dropping off. This will mean that parents can park safely and walk across the road safety using the pedestrian crossing.

Thank you in advance for your support in this important issue and let's hope together we can ensure the safety of the children and be more considerate to our local residents. We now have a solution to the dropping off and picking up difficulty and I urge parents to make sure they use the Park and Stride, rather than break the law and put the safety of our children at risk.

Please do think of ways you may be able to walk to school in order to reduce the traffic, be more healthy and eco-friendly.


