# From the Headteacher


Dear St Peter's Families,

We have discussed the importance of being responsible when online and have encouraged them to think very carefully before they post a message, to ensure it will not cause offence or upset to others. We have discussed at length on how to respond to offensive messages and what steps the children should take. We will continue to address online safety through our curriculum (to the whole school) and hope that you can reiterate this to your children at home. We would also ask that you continue to monitor your child's use of technology frequently. This is for all year groups!

Thank you for your continued support; together we can support and educate the children to use technology responsibly and respectfully so that everyone can enjoy its benefits and feel safe.


#### **PTA**
