Dear All,

Firstly - an apology. As you may have gathered, we became a little short staffed before half term and the school didn't run as smoothly as it normally does. On one day last half term we had 10 members of staff off, some with covid and other reasons. We are so lucky at St. Peter's that we have a large number of qualified teachers who work as TAs who are happy to cover, however we were more stretched then ever so our consistency and continuity wasn't as smooth as normal in some year groups. We did manage to fully staff our residential visits and the other children received their normal high quality teaching, however, we are so relieved to be back up to full strength with a full staffing complement today - for the first time since the start of covid! 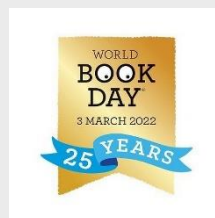

BOOK WEEK

Book Week and World Book Day are THIS WEEK - it's one of our favourite times of the year! What's not to love about a whole week dedicated to books and reading? Stories, poems and non-fiction

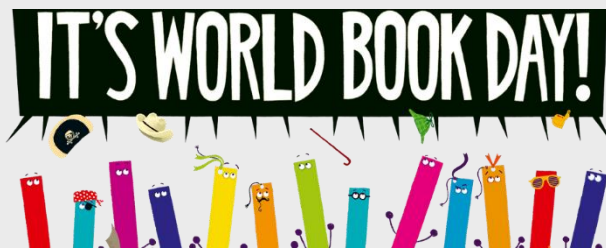

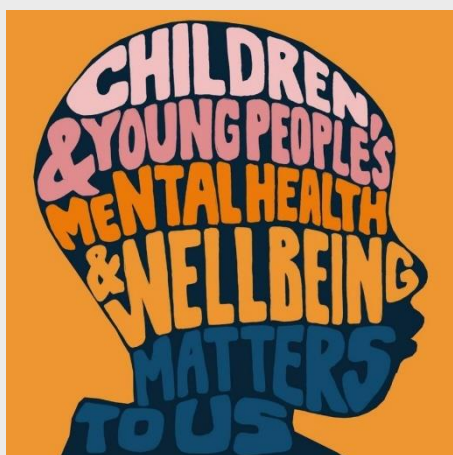
RAISING MONEY FOR UKRIANE CRISIS RELIEF FUND

SAFEGUARDING UPDATE FROM OUR DESIGNATED SAFEUARDING LEADS (DSLs)

What is Safeguarding?

All organisations that work with or come into contact with children have safeguarding policies and procedures to ensure that every child, regardless of their age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex, or sexual orientation, has a right to equal protection from harm.

Setting up and following good safeguarding policies and procedures means children are safe from adults and other children who might pose a risk. Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding means:

- protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- preventing harm to children's health or development
- ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes.

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process. It focuses on protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child. (Taken from the NSPCC website.)

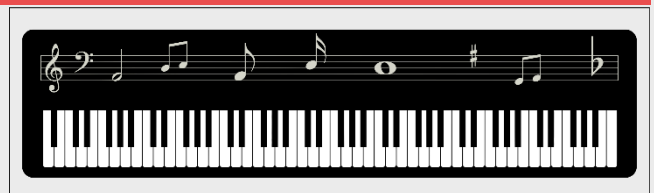

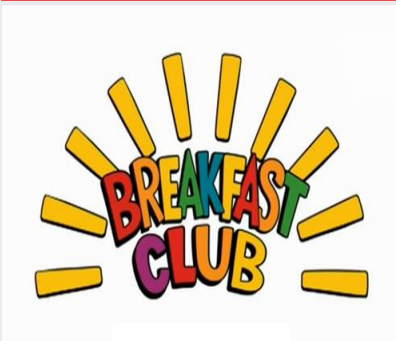
