We have had another great few weeks at St Peter's with the children engaging in lots of exciting learning opportunities. RECEPTION



I read so many brilliant books over the summer holidays but this was one of my favourites! Holes, written by Louis Sachar, tells the story of Stanley Yelnats, who is wrongly sent to Camp Green Lake Juvenile Detention Centre (which isn't green and doesn't have a lake). Every day he and the other inmates are told to dig a hole, five foot wide by five foot deep, reporting anything they find. Why? The evil warden claims that it's character building, but this is a lie. It's up to Stanley to dig up the truth. This book was a real page turner and I literally couldn't put it down. I would recommend this book for our older children (Y5/6), who enjoy a book with some twists and turns and a great story line. The book has also been adapted into a film but I would definitely read the book first!
