

Parent Support Advisor Role - We are very lucky at St Peter's to have two PSA's in role, Mrs Robinson and Mrs Wilson. They play a vital part in school in many areas such as safeguarding, attendance and parent support - this can be financial, housing, medical, applying for secondary schools, these are just a few to name. We wanted to make you aware that if you feel unsure of where to go try school first as our PSA's may be able to help.





Reducing Parental Conflict - Another part of our PSA's role is around attending training and promoting awareness on different subjects. As a school and many of us as parents we understand and can empathise with the everyday challenges and stress that life can throw at us and also how that may impact on homelife with our partners, past or present. It can be easy at these moments to break out into an argument and as a result of that more often than not our children can be witness and/or involved. Now, it would be very unrealistic to say we were never going to argue again, however, what we can do is try to 'do it better'. There will be three flyers sent out via ParentMail which will provide information on each and give families an opportunity to register and complete awareness and resources to help. It was too tricky to pick just one fabulous book to share with you this week so I have gone for some of my favourites for each of the different age ranges.




My EYFS/KS1 book recommendation is The Baddies, by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. The Baddies is their latest book collaboration and tells the story of a little girl's bravery against some storybook villains. My little boy thinks this book is very funny and loves joining in with the story.



For Years 2, 3 and 4, my book recommendation is Harper the Confidence Fairy, is the newest story book from the Rainbow Magic series. Harper is the first fairy with

Down's Syndrome and she helps people to find and grow their inner confidence. This is a heartwarming book with three short stories that explain and discuss differences in people and what makes us all special and unique.



My KS2 (Year 4+) book recommendation is a recently published book that I am currently reading and sharing with my daughter. She was lucky enough to have S F Said (the author) visit her school last term and is a big fan! His newest book, Tyger, took him nearly 9 years to write and I am LOVING it so far.
