DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY WEEK

This week has been a wonderful opportunity for the children to get stuck into their termly DT projects. Children have been able to explore products from the real world including toy cars, packaging and even Subway sandwiches. Through exploration, they have been given ideas to support them when designing their own products and the children have then been able to put any new skills or techniques into practice within the making stage of the process. All of the projects are presented with a purpose in mind and all children will evaluate their final products, looking at whether they fit the criteria or if they would change something.

We have been invited to join a Lincolnshire campaign to reduce the amount of sugar in our diet. We look forward to working with the children on this project as we know they will have some fabulous ideas! Here's some information from Lincolnshire County Council -

This project has been created by the Food Education Team (LCC) and Public Health. With children's health in mind, we would like to work with schools to reduce added sugar in children's diets across the school day. We know that rates of childhood obesity and dental decay are higher in many areas of Lincolnshire than the regional and national average. Most children consume much more added sugar than their recommended daily



allowance, so we'd like schools to pledge to reduce sugar in order to promote better health and encourage healthier lifestyle choices.
