



FRIENDS OF THE SCHOOL



BOOK REVIEW



Miss Foxcroft's Book Review

The Land of Roar is a wonderfully imaginative start to a children's fantasy series and earns its place beside favorites like *The Chronicles of Narnia* and *How to Train Your Dragon*. I love a story that celebrates creativity while offering emotional depth, and this book does both.

The story follows eleven-year-old twins Arthur and Rose, who once played in the Land of Roar- an imaginative world entered through the folding bed in their grandad's attic. Roar is filled with dragons, mermaids, ninja wizards, and just enough spooky danger to keep readers eager for more. Now that the twins are older, Roar feels like a memory. Until Grandad is suddenly pulled through the bed and

disappears, forcing them to consider that their pretend world might be real.

Engaging, humorous, and heartfelt, *The Land of Roar* is an excellent choice for independent reading or a good bedtime story.
