Dear All,

I hope that you and all your family are keeping well and safe. Whilst it does feel that we are closer to the finishing line, we certainly continue to be in challenging circumstances - our first bubble in Year 3 closed today due to a positive case. As always at St. Peter's, we have the wellbeing of our children, staff and families at the forefront of any decision making and we are working with Health Protection UK to ensure that all the necessary actions have been completed. Thank you so much to all the staff and parents who acted so quickly today to ensure everyone's safety. This bubble will be closed until the full reopening of St. Peter's on 8th March.

I know some families have not been allocated a school place which they would have liked for their child. The requests have been overwhelming over half term for critical workers that need to return to work but cannot. This lack of space has been very difficult and my sincere apologies to anyone who has been in this position. We now look forward to the forthcoming changes and the roadmap to recovery.

We are absolutely delighted that we can fully reopen to all children on the 8th of March. Please rest assured, we are taking a very cautious approach. The children will have increased hygiene routines, hand washing will be paramount, their contact with others will be limited and every precaution will be taken. Whilst we have enjoyed the challenges and some benefits to home learning, we are looking forward to all the children seeing their friends, their teacher and returning to some sort of normality.

Our time over lockdown has been challenging, but there have been so many successes seen. Some children have thrived at home and we can see they are making phenomenal progress. Some children in school have enjoyed the smaller class sizes and have amazed their teachers with what they have achieved. Everyone has done their best in whatever circumstances they have found themselves in. We have loved the Lockdown family challenges, our family quizzes, Zooms, live teaching, home deliveries and online Collective Worships. Next week promises to be a lot of fun as we look forward to World Book Day, special book deliveries for all children, a reading Kahoot quiz, book character potatoes and a masked reader competition. It honestly sounds like a week of treats!

As we look to the future, the reopening curriculum will focus on the children's mental and physical wellbeing, as well as catchup in every area, not just academically. For example, we hope to take the children on a whole school trip to Skegness when it is deemed safe to make up for all the lost opportunities.

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BOOK WEEK

Book Week and World Book Day are fast approaching - it's one of our favourite times of the year at St. Peters! What's not to love about a whole week dedicated to books and reading? We have lots of exciting things planned for this year for children at home and in school. Google Classroom and Tapestry daily timetables will reflect any extra sessions that children are invited to attend, such as author webinars and online story times.


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<u>The Big Book Week Quiz</u>
