With social distancing and hygiene rules in force, we have planned a careful system to help ensure collecting new books from school is safe and organised. If your child would like to return their reading books to school and collect some new ones, please contact your child's class teacher via email, Tapestry or Google Classroom, who will prepare a selection of new

We will ensure books are matched to your child's reading ability but cannot guarantee specific books unfortunately. Please contact your child's class teacher as soon as possible to ensure they have plenty of time to prepare the books.

Emailing will ensure they receive your request as sometimes Facebook and Twitter posts may be missed. The new books for your child will be placed in a named envelope in the school playground for parents to collect on the given days below. We have assigned days to avoid the possibility of large numbers of parents coming to collect books at the same time. When collecting and returning, please ensure that you

only pick up the envelope with your child's name in it. Returned books should be placed in the labelled box. Parents will need to press the buzzer to gain entry to the playground and a member of staff will let you in to collect the books.

We also want to take this opportunity to remind you about the many websites offering free eBooks such as Epic and Oxford Owl. More information can be found in the Home Learning section of our school website. There you will also find a Reading at Home tab with useful websites and ideas.

SUPPORT AVAILABLE FOR FAMILIES THROUGH ST. SWITHINS


If any families are in any sort of need, we are so lucky to be working with St. Swithins that have volunteers
