

Children should complete at least one homework project to a high quality this term- something that they have enjoyed working on and that they can feel proud of.

Research more about a famous Viking, such as Eric Bloodaxe (885-954), Leif Erikson (c.970-1020, King Canute (990-1035) or Harald Hardrada (c.1015-1066). Why were they famous? Think about how you could creatively present your findings.

Find out more about life as an Anglo-Saxon or Viking child. Write about the similarities and differences between you both. You could include information about their day, school, family, toys, pets and work.

Create a timeline of key events that happened between the start of the Anglo-Saxon era and the end of the Viking era.

Y5/6 autumn term topic homework project - Is calling the Vikings vicious killers and thieves fair?

Anything of your choice linked to our topic!

Can you design (and make) your own Viking shield? Viking shields were usually made of wood and were circular shaped. The colours and patterns decorating them were different for the different people that used them.

Construct an Anglo-Saxon or Viking home model or diagram. Think about the features of the home and write how it is different to our homes now.

Use books and the internet to research the Viking gods and goddesses further. You could create a fact file about your favourite one!
